- Across the whole research group, only five participants earned the Minimum Income Standard and had around £1200 to spend a month after paying rent.
- For the other 46, after paying rent and after tax, people were living on around £500 a month and in some cases as little as £300.

"...I only eat one meal a day. It is for costs. It is for the kids."

The cost of imprisonment is overwhelmingly borne by single women on low incomes, who describe 'Coping' with the costs through:

> sacrifices and silent suffering, food poverty, fuel poverty, lack of 'free' time, isolation and loss of connection...

Families already in poverty are being **squeezed financially**, to the point of being **crushed**.
